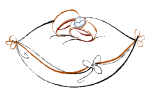

A VIEW FROM LATHA'S WINDOW:

A Father's Irreplaceable Role

Cleaning and scrubbing can wait till tomorrow for babies grow up we learn to our sorrow. So quiet down cobwebs and dust go to sleep I'm rocking my baby and babies don't keep.

The nursery rhyme was given to me when we had our first child and consciously I made every effort to hold true to the words in the poem when our children were young. Some of my best memories came from spending personal time doing impromptu activities that were not on our list of "daily chores or routines." I would say to them, "Every now and then it's important to get off life's merry-go-round." Time is too short not to enjoy life.

Pope Francis recently addressed the importance of fathers to spend time with their children. He said, "When children feel neglected by their fathers who focus only on their problems, on their work or on their own personal realizations this creates a situation of orphans in the children and youth of today, who live disoriented, without the good example or prudent guidance of a father."

More than ever today's parents worry about real life issues like peer pressure, substance abuse and violence that surrounds their children's lives. As important and challenging as it is to provide and meet their children's needs, Pope Francis cautioned fathers about the temptation of trying to be a friend more than a parent. He addressed the idea by saying, "although being a friend and a companion to one's child is good, the role of the parent is essential. It's true that you need to be the friend of your child, but without forgetting that you are a father. If you are only there for your child as a friend, it won't be good for them."

Pope Francis notes that fathers are necessary as examples and guides for their children in wisdom and virtue. "Without father figures, young people often feel orphaned; left adrift at a critical moment in their growth and development." In summary, Pope Francis asks fathers "if they have the courage of love to waste their time with their children."

In the Gospel of John our Lord Jesus promises that He would not leave us orphans. Pope Francis prays that the Lord would "deepen and renew our appreciation of fatherhood and raise up good fathers for the benefit of our families, our Church and our world."

Purposeful parenting takes a lot of work, but it also takes a lot more grace than many parenting experts understand. It's the grace that comes from making mistakes and learning to trust God to make up the difference between our own best efforts and his incomparable love. Raising God-First Kids in a Me-First World

Playing video games and extracurricular activities can wait till tomorrow for children grow up we learn to our sorrow. So, fathers, place your problems in God's hands for him to resolve and have your personal realizations take a back seat and say I'm spending my time with my children as children don't keep.
